Year 3 & 5 NAPLAN Reading/Writing 2022. % of students meeting year level reading targets (aligned to Regional measures) in each semester. Comparison: English, %A, %B and %C or better. Reading/Writing NAPLAN relative gain. Performance against Similar Queensland State Schools (SQSS). Monitoring: P-6 formative assessment used to monitor progress and plan for next steps in student learning. Staff satisfaction levels around resourcing and support for reading/writing from School Opinion Survey (SOS). Teacher planning includes evidence of differentiated teaching and learning of writing appropriate to writing demands of different subject/learning areas. Provide two 0.6FTE (1.2FTE total) HOD-C staff members to lead and build teacher capacity by monitoring peadagogical practices and developing/implementing support programs within the school. The remainder of their fraction will be sourced from school funds to make them full time.	Staffing \$156 000 Resources \$1
Extra teacher aide support to reduce the adult:student ratio for small group intervention/extension/support. Extra aide/AO time for Administration team to provide student support and assist with resource development	\$55 000
Purchase reading and writing resources to allow students access to a wider variety of targeted genres/text types that complements the classroom curriculum and develops comprehension skills.	Reading resources \$1

Provide collaborative planning days for all year levels whereby teachers are offline for a day each term. Teachers will improve their ability to identify the reading and writing demands of 'units of work' by working with curriculum leaders/support staff.	TRS \$94 600
